Wounded Warrior Care Center provides exemplary care to injured Marines and Sailors

During October 2011, Camp Pendleton's Wounded Warrior Care Center opened. The Wounded Warrior Barracks is a twostory building which consists of 66,000 square foot state-ofthe-art facility. This much needed facility costing \$29 million,

will have billeting/barracks for 200 Marines/ sailors, 38 offices (to include spaces for federal agencies, including the departments of Veteran Affairs and Labor, education specialists and chaplain services, spaces for counseling, mental health recovery), patient reconditioning program/ facilities and transportation services for the wounded, sick and injured Marines, sailors and their families.

This facility continues to treat Marine/sailors injured in battle, those involved in regional training incidents or off-base accidents that does not require long-term hospitalization.

Inside the facility there are 100 rooms which will house two-individuals per room. Each room will contain iPod alarm clocks, a refrigerator, sink area, cabinets, a large HDTV, dresser cabinets and a

bathroom with shower. The building also has a kitchen area, balcony and outdoor patio with picnic areas and a basketball court.

On May 3, 2012 the largest shopping experience in the Marine Corps was introduced to the service members and their families aboard Camp Pendleton. The recently constructed Marine Corps Exchange (MCX) opened near Pendleton's Main Gate directly adjacent to the Pacific Plaza and will offer customers an expanded variety of consumer goods.

The MCX facility consists of 147,000 square feet and will provide convenient, one-stop services and sales to cover 41,000 Marines, sailors, countless dependents and retired veterans. Some of the MCX's products and services include the following: Marine Corps Community Services retail, military clothing, barber shop, vision

center, watch and jewelry repair, engraving shop, computer technicians, cell phone vendor, Yogurt Land, Duncan' Donuts, tailor shop, 24-hour dry cleaners, a florist and many more. Previous offered products and amenities previously offered at the 11 Area MCX, electronic store and novelty store were relocated to the 20 area. Due to the opening of the MCX in the 20 area, the former 11 area clothing store is now a miniature version of new MCX.


New Camp Pendleton Hospital is On Schedule

The new Camp Pendleton hospital, located near the Main Gate of Camp Pendleton and right off of Vandegrift Blvd. just before the new PX, started in September 2010 and is scheduled to be completed in early 2014.

This replacement hospital is the largest American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) project in the Department of the Navy and is situated on 70 acres. This hospital will be a multilevel 500,000 sq.ft. hospital and include a 2,500 space multi-level parking structure.

Additionally, there is a Hope and Care Center that features an indoor therapy pool, a one-eighth mile padded/cork mile running track and chin-up bars scattered through out the complex. The Wounded Warrior Barracks were built to LEED Gold Standards, new energy and water efficient methods and water tolerant landscape features. Many of the cabinets and concrete materials also came from recycled goods.


